HOW DOES IT WORK?

THE SILENT AUCTION

NAVIGATING THE SILENT AUCTION

The Silent Auction is held in the Learning Center. Items and services are categorized by type. Closing time varies for each category of item and service.

BIDDING IN THE SILENT AUCTION

If you are the first to place a bid, make note of the minimum bid amount. Once an initial bid has been made, write your bid number and name on the next line. The dollar amounts are pre-filled. Note that some items are sold for a flat price and no additional price increase is needed. These will be clearly marked. Pay close attention as we inch toward 6:15 to 6:45 p.m., when sections of the silent auction close and highest bid wins.

BASKET RAFFLE

NEW THIS YEAR! Raffle tickets are \$1 each. Put as many tickets into the box for any basket you want a chance to win. Winners are drawn during the live auction. **You must be present to win!**

THE LIVE AUCTION

The live auction begins at 7 p.m. in the Sanctuary. You don't want to miss it!

BIDDING IN THE LIVE AUCTION

When you are bidding make sure the auctioneers can see your number! If you win an item with multiple winners, be prepared to say how many spots you want (for example, two for a dinner.) You will pay the amount of the winning bid times the number of spots you purchase. Keep track of what you win in the back of this book! The Live Auction ends at 9 p.m.

CHECK OUT

HOW DO I PAY AND GET THE ITEMS I WON?

NEW THIS YEAR: If you have a credit card on file and did not purchase any physical items, you do not need to go through checkout in the Founder's Room. You can go home and we will email you a receipt. If you won physical items or did not put a credit card on file, checkout begins in the Founder's Room once the live auction is completed. There will be several cashiers who have all of your winning bids and will provide you with an itemized list. Payment can be made by cash, check or credit/debit (with processing fee). Take your itemized receipt to the Learning Center to retrieve any physical items you won. You must have your receipt to retrieve your items. Itemized receipts are also emailed so you have a record of what you purchased. The donor will have the list of purchasers and will contact you directly with the details. If there is any confusion or uncertainty, please email the auction committee chairs. We'll help you get it all sorted.

AFTER THE AUCTION

Go home and remember your great night! Share all the great parties you are going to enjoy throughout the year with your friends. Sunday morning after the auction, if any items did not sell, or there are any open spaces at parties, you can still bid on them. Be prepared to pay for those items should you choose to do just a little more bidding.

This vintage, midcentury ginger jar is blue and gold porcelain with a peacock motif.

Smoking tobacco was illegal during the Qing Dynasty, but the use of snuff was allowed because the Chinese considered it to be a remedy for common illnesses such as colds, headaches and stomach disorders.
