HOW DOES IT WORK?

THE SILENT AUCTION

NAVIGATING THE SILENT AUCTION

The Silent Auction is held in the Learning Center. Items and services are categorized by type. Closing time varies for each category of item and service.

BIDDING IN THE SILENT AUCTION

If you are the first to place a bid, make note of the minimum bid amount. Once an initial bid has been made, write your bid number and name on the next line. The dollar amounts are pre-filled. Note that some items are sold for a flat price and no additional price increase is needed. These will be clearly marked. Pay close attention as we inch toward 6:15 to 6:45 p.m., when sections of the silent auction close and highest bid wins.

BASKET RAFFLE

BACK THIS YEAR! Tickets are \$1 each. Put as many tickets into the box for any basket you want a chance to win. Winners are drawn during the live auction. **You must be present to win!**

THE LIVE AUCTION

The live auction begins at 7 p.m. in the Sanctuary. You don't want to miss it!

BIDDING IN THE LIVE AUCTION

When you are bidding make sure the auctioneers can see your number! If you win an item with multiple winners, be prepared to say how many spots you want (for example, two for a dinner.) You will pay the amount of

the winning bid times the number of spots you purchase. Keep track of what you win in the back of this book! The Live Auction ends at 9 p.m.

CHECK OUT

HOW DO I PAY AND GET THE ITEMS I WON?

After the Live Auction, come to the Learning Center through the main doors off the lobby. Find the counter that corresponds to your bid number. A volunteer will give you an invoice to review and your Silent Auction items. If you have an issue with your invoice or wish to pay that night, proceed to the Founders Room. Otherwise, exit through the same door through which you entered and you can leave. Bring a check or other form of payment to church the next day and drop it off before either service. We will process the payment and provide a paid receipt after.

AFTER THE AUCTION

Go home and remember your great night! Share all the great parties you are going to enjoy throughout the year with your friends. Sunday morning after the auction, if any items did not sell, or there are any open spaces at parties, you can still bid on them. Be prepared to pay for those items should you choose to do just a little more bidding.
